Maryellen Staab, the Director of Housing Development for Catholic Charities Housing Corporation, will be in the back vestibule of our Church after the 8:00 am & 10:30 am Masses this weekend to answer questions concerning the proposed Senior Housing for our parish. Please consider coming to the Town Hall Meeting this Tuesday, January 19th, at 6:00 pm in the social hall where at this time Maryellen will give a short presentation and update us and the community on the status of the proposed Senior Housing project. It becoming a reality would enhance our parish as well as our neighborhood.

Within the last two weeks, technicians from ABCO were here to inspect and certify the fire extinguishers and hood system in our school. I talked to Meran Rogers, the founder of GALA, last Friday. She was here with representatives from the Sherwin Williams Corporation. The purpose of their visit was to see if our school qualifies to be assisted by the company's employee community outreach program. If our site is chosen, volunteers from Sherwin Williams will supply the materials and labor to paint the area of the school that is leased. Please pray that our site is chosen.
