Ministry to those who are Sick or Shut-In

Our Eucharistic Ministers can bring the Eucharist to those parishioners who are ill, recovering from a hospital stay, shut-in, or otherwise unable to attend the Liturgies each Sunday. Please call the Parish Office to be placed on the schedule.

How does the garden grow?

Over the past 6 weeks, members of the Gardening Committee have been hard at work adding a bit of summer color to the Parish grounds.

As in past years, the areas around the Sacred Heart Shrine and picnic table have been planted, as well as the large pots on the front steps.

New this year are plantings under the flowering trees, around the parish sign, and also in front of the Rectory. We also added some plants around the church foundation.

One major project remains, that being the relocation of lilies and bulbs from behind the De Paul Center to the front of the east parking lot, where they should soften the starkness of the guard rail and add visual enjoyment for everyone.

The delay is because the soil is very poor in that area – it's dust rather than soil. As such, it does not hold water or nutrients to sustain the plants. How the trees manage to survive there is a matter of wonder. What flowers we've planted there so far are struggling - and they keep Fr. Clancy busy every day with the 100 ft. hose.

To remedy the conditions will require an addition of 10 cubic yards of leaf humus to the area, at a cost of approximately \$400.00.
