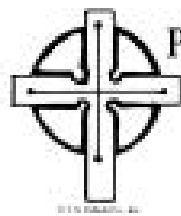

PASTOR'S NOTES

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate Priesthood Sunday. The purpose of the celebration is to set aside time for us as a Church to celebrate the gift of Priesthood in the life of the Church. It's a time for all of us to reflect on the ministry that priests share with us when we gather around the Altar or when called during times of need. It's important to remember that a person is called from the community for the community. A limited amount of Holy Cards that contain a prayer for Priests and Seminarians are at the entrances of the Church please feel free to take one while they last and take the time to say the prayer for our priests and current seminarians.

This Tuesday we celebrate the Feast of **All Saints' Day** a solemn Holy Day of Obligation in our Catholic Church. There will be a 7:00 pm Vigil Mass on Monday, October 31st, and an 8:30 am Mass and 7:00 pm Mass on Tuesday, November 1st. We dedicate this day to the Saints of the Church, those who have attained heaven. Although millions or even billions of people may already be saints, All Saints' Day Observances usually focus on known saints who are recognized in the Canon of the Saints by the Catholic Church.

On Wednesday, November 2nd, we celebrate **All Souls Day**. All Souls is a day that is set aside for honoring the dead. According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go. Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleaned and perfected before they enter into heaven. Catholics believe that we can help these souls through our prayers here on earth, in the cleansing of their sins so they may enter heaven.

We will have a 7:00 pm Mass on November 2nd to carry on the tradition started here at St. Vincent de Paul by Fr. Mike Ausperk. At this Mass, we will be remembering those registered parishioners who passed away this past year.

Also in your envelope packet you received an All Souls envelope. Please feel free to write the names of loved ones who have died on the envelope and place whatever donation you feel is appropriate in the envelope. The envelopes

will be placed on the altar for the month of November and will be acknowledged in the weekend Prayers of the Faithful. Any donations received will be placed in the parish Mass Fund.

Finally, last week Scott Meade, Head of Maintenance, removed the evergreens that surrounded the Shrine. This became necessary because a number of the trees had died. It really opens up the area now. In the spring, Scott will power wash the bricks of the Shrine to brighten it up. A special thank you to Fr. Clancy and the Gardening Committee who have done a wonderful job sprucing up the parish grounds. Thanks to all of you who have donated for flowers. We've received a number of compliments.
