Marriages require a six month preparation period by Diocesan policy. Call one of the parish priests prior to setting a date.


Funerals: Arrangements are to be made at the Parish Office before publication of the death notice.

PASTOR'S NOTES

Dear Parishioner's,

Last week I announced the dropping of the 12:00 pm Mass effective the Sunday after Easter. We had hoped with two Priests being here we could keep it going. However, today for example, in our Diocese three priests are on medical leave for treatment of a serious illness, specifically two in Cuyahoga County and one in Lorain County. These medical leaves were unplanned. All three of them are from one man parishes and all three of them are relatively young. Thus those parishes have to be covered for weekdays and weekends. As the Priest population continues to age this will become more frequent.

In changing our Mass Schedule, we will be able to assist in coverage from time to time as needed. Also it will make it easier for the Diocese to find coverage for us if needed for vacation or medical issues. This will better insure keeping our parish open as we weather this crisis in Priestly vocations and continue with our goal to make our parish as vibrant as possible and to continue to build up our parish community. I believe because of your kindness to guests as well as your active participation in the Liturgies we are well on the way. Who knows, someday we may have to bring a Mass Back.
