Chaplet of Divine Mercy and Benediction is on the First Sunday of the month at 3:00 pm.

Marriages require a six month preparation period by Diocesan policy. Call one of the parish priests prior to setting a date.

Funerals: Arrangements are to be made at the Parish Office before publication of the death notice.

Ministry to those who are Sick or Shut-In

Our Eucharistic Ministers can bring the Eucharist to those parishioners who are ill, recovering from a hospital stay, shut-in, or otherwise unable to attend the Liturgies each Sunday. Please call the Parish Office to be placed on the schedule.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process by which adults are brought into the Catholic Faith through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. The RCIA meets weekly from September through April. Further information can be obtained by calling the Parish Office.



CLOTHING THE MYSTERY

The doctrine of the Trinity strikes many, both Christians and non-Christians, as one of the more exotic and esoteric of Christian doctrines. Somehow, three divine persons add up to one God. But today's scriptures cut to the heart of the matter. The doctrine of the Trinity is our way of understanding the truth that we live every day as Christians: that God the Father has saved us through his Son Jesus Christ and made us into one people, united in the Holy Spirit. It is the experience of this salvation that is the root of our knowledge of God as Trinity.

God is, from all eternity, a communion of love shared among Father, Son, and Spirit. It is because God includes us in this eternal love through becoming one of us in Jesus that we have eternal life. Our salvation is nothing less than our inclusion in the love that is the Holy Trinity. This is one reason why Paul exhorts the Corinthians to "encourage one another, agree with one another, and live in peace." It is through actions such as these that our lives mirror the communion of love that is the Trinity.

"God of love, help me to seek your presence day by day, so I may come to live in you, and one day live with you for eternity." Amen.

PASTOR'S NOTES

Dear Parishioners,

This week we welcome Missionary Fr. John Nedumcheril from the Diocese of Pathanamthitta, South India, to St. Vincent de Paul Parish. Fr. John will be making a Mission Appeal on behalf of his Diocese.

On Monday of this past week, Action Door repaired the three double outer doors located in the back of the church. This entailed replacing all of the closers to alleviate the doors from not closing properly, particularly the center door which would hang open when unlocked. In addition crash bars were added to all three doors. It was getting to the point that the doors could be opened with one good tug. Entrance for **daily Mass** will now be exclusively through the **east side entrance** of the church. Those wishing to use the rear doors to exit after daily Mass will still have the ability to use them. On weekends, Holy Days, funerals and weddings, the back center door will be unlocked as usual.

A neighborhood Safety Seminar will be held on Tuesday, June 13th from 7:00 pm until 8:00 pm at the Knights of Columbus Hall, 3556 W. 130th St. (behind CVS). You will have the opportunity to talk to Councilman Kazy, Commander Fay, Community Relations and others about the safety of the neighborhood as well as hear from them all that is being done to keep us safe. It's also a good way of keeping them in the loop both with concerns as well as compliments on what is benefiting the safety of our neighborhood.

It's getting closer now, just two weeks from this Sunday, our Annual Parish Picnic will be held from 12:00 pm until 3:30 pm. Once again the Marketing Team has a side dish tree set up in front of the church for those who wish to share a side dish for the picnic.

Finally, on a personal note during Mass last Sunday, I remembered it was the second Anniversary of my arriving back to St. Vincent de Paul. I can't believe how fast the time has flown. I want to express my gratitude to all of you for making it two wonderful years. You did this through your prayers, support and many acts of kindness. I am truly blessed to be here.
